VII. Biographical note:

The Calvary Industrial Home was a charitable organization incorporated in 1895 by the House of Representatives of the State of Connecticut. It provided lodging and employment for New Haven men unable to find other support -- mostly alcoholics. In winter and fall their principal occupation was to haul wood to the apartments of Yale students. As a private non-profit corporation, the Home depended financially on the charity of New Haven residents. It was absorbed in 1911 by the local Salvation Army.
