Introduction

Henry G. Thompson, a manufacturer of Hack saws, hack saw blades, and other types of saws, began his business in Milford in 1876. He later relocated to Chapel Street in New Haven. In 1972, the company moved to Branford as a subsidiary of the Vermont American Corporation. It later became known as Sanvik Manufacturing. This collection contains a steel plate engraving of Henry Thompson, photographs of the Chapel Street and Branford plants, employee photographs, and press releases.
