VII. Biographical note: The Ingersolls whose papers are in this collection were descended from John Ingersoll (1615-1684), who was born in Bedfordshire, England and emigrated to America in 1629. John Ingersoll eventually settled in Westfield, Mass. where he married his third wife, Mary Webster Hunt,granddaughter of John Webster, a former governor of the Connecticut Colony.

John Ingersoll's 15th child, Jonathan (1681-1760) was born in Westfield, graduated from Harvard in 1702 and settled in Milford, Conn. He married Sarah Newton Miles and they had 6 children, two of whom are of interest to this collection.

Jonathan Ingersoll (1713-1778), the eldest child, was born in Milford. After graduating from Yale in 1736, he married Dorcas Moss of Derby, Conn. and in 1740 was installed as minister of the First Congregational Church of Ridgefield, Conn. where he spent the remainder of his life.

The collection contains letters to and from Jonathan to his younger brother, Jaced Ingersoll, Sr. (1722-1781), whose papers comprise the bulk of the documents. Jared was born in Milford in 1722 and graduated from Yale in 1742. In 1743 he married Hannah Whiting of New Haven and began the practice of law in New Haven. By 1757 he held the office of King's attorney, and in 1758 he was appointed by the General Assembly as agent for the Colony at the Court of Great Britain. He resided in London from 1759-60, specializing in prosecuting claims of the Colony for reimbursement of expenses incurred during the French and Indian Wars. Jared returned to American in 1761 but went back to England in 1764 on private business - concerning a contract with the Navy to supply a load of masts from the Connecticut River. While in England, he was appointed Stamp Distributor for Conn. under the newly enacted Stamp Act of 1765. He returned to America in July, 1765, but public opinion against the Stamp Act fored him to resign his office. He returned to the private practice of law, and in 1769 was appointed judge of the Court of Vice-Admiralty in the Middle Colonies. He moved his family to Philadelphia in 1771. During the Revolution, he was obliged to give up his judicial duties and he returned to New Haven in 1777s He died in New Faven in 1781 at the age of 59.

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Jared Ingersoll had four children. The only one to survive him was <u>Jared</u> <u>Ingersoll, Jr</u>., who was born in New Haven in 1749. Jared, Jr. studied law with his father and moved to Philadelphia with the family in 1771. In 1774 he was sent to London to finish his legal education, entering the Middle Temple. In 1778 he returned to Philadelphia and was admitted to practice in the Supreme Court in 1779. Unlike his father, he was a devotee of the American cause and in 1780-81 he served in the Continental Congress. In 1787 he was a delegate to the Constitutional Convention and a signer of the Constitution. In addition to being a prominent lawyer in Philadelphia, he engaged in public service. He was the first Attorney General of Pennsylvania; U.S. District Attorney for Penn., and in 1812 the candidate for Vice-President of the U.S. on the ticket with DeWitt Clinton. His last service was that of chief judge of the District Court of Philadlphia, a post he held until his death in October, 1822. He was married to Elizabeth Pettit of Philadelphia and had four sons, three of whom survived him and became prominent lawyers in Philadelphia.

Jonathan Ingersoll, Jr. (1747-1823) was the son of the Reverend Jonathan of Ridgefield, the newphew of Jared, Sr. and first cousin to Jared, Jr. He was born in Ridgefield and graduated from Yale in 1766. He studied law in Middletown with Titus Hosmer and upon admission to the bar, settled in New Haven. When his uncle. Jared, Sr. moved to Philadelphia, Jonathan took over his practice. He took no part in the Revolution and he did not enter public life until 1785 when he became a member of the Conn. General Assembly. In 1792 he was elected to the State Senate, and in 1798 he was chosen judge of the Superior Court, serving until 1801. In 1816 he was elected Lieutenant Governor of the state, an office he held until his death in 1823 at age 76. Jonathan, Jr. was married in 1786 to Grace Isaacs, daughter of Ralph Isaacs, a prominent New Haven merchant. They had 10 children.

Jonathan, Jr.'s eldest son, <u>Ralph Isaacs Ingersoll</u>, was born in New Haven in 1789 and graduated from Yale in 1808. After graduation he read law and was admitted to the bar in 1810. By 1817-18 he entered political life as a Democrat and was an unsuccessful candidate for Congress, but in 1819 he was elected to the Conn. General Assembly and became Speaker in 1824. In 1825 he was elected to the U.S. Congress where he remained until 1833. He also served as mayor of New Haven in 1830-31. In 1833 he returned to law practice and became State Attorney for New Haven County. After declining to run for office again, he was nominated in 1846 by President Polk to be Minister to Russia. He remained in Russia until 1848, when he returned to his law practice in New Haven. He died in New Haven in 1872 at age 84. He was married to Margaret VanderHeuvel of New York . Among his children were Charles Roberts, a governor of Conn. Another son, Colin, was a member of Congress.

<u>Charles Anthony Ingersoll</u>, (1798-1860), a younger brother of Ralph I. Ingersoll, was born in New Haven and also studied law. He served as State's Attorney from 1849 to 1853 and in 1853 he was appointed judge of the U.S. District Court of Conn., a post he held until his death. He had three sons, among them <u>Jonathan Ingersoll</u> who was born in New Haven in 1848, graduated from Yale and practiced law in New Haven. He, too, held judicial offices in Conn. until he moved to the Pacific coast in 1889, where he died in 1926.

William Joseph Whiting, 1760-1794, whose form book is in the collection, was the son of John Whiting and Sarah Ingersoll Whiting (a sister of Jonathan and Jared, Sr.) He was a first cousin of Jonathan, Jr., with whom he studied law.

Dumas Malone), Vol. IX, pp. 467-469 for biographies of Jared, Sr. and Jared, Jr. <u>Analysis</u>: The Ingersoll Papers were presented to the Society upon the death of Charles R. Ingersoll, grandson of Judge Jonathan Ingersoll. There are approximately 2050 documents in seven boxes, one half-box, and four oversize folders. Six boxes hold the papers of Jared Ingersoll, Sr., and the remainder of the collection is comprised of letters from Jared, Jr. to his cousin Jonathan Jr.; the legal and personal papers of Jonathan, Jr.; papers of Ralph I. Ingersoll; and a few documents of Charles Anthony Ingersoll, his son Jonathan, and W. J. Whiting. Most are loose manuscripts, with a few Account and Docket Books included.

The papers date from 1676 (the early papers are most likely copies of documents used by Jared, Sr. and Jonathan, Jr. in their practices) to 1874 (a document of Jonathan, son of Charles A.) They are subdivided under the individual who generated them, e.g., the bulk of the collection consists of the papers of Jared, Sr.: chiefly correspondence, personal and legal papers. The correspondence (incoming and outgoing) is filed alphabetically by sender and recipient. The other documents are filed chronologically under subject, e.g., household accounts, papers relating to the Susquehannah Co., court docket books, court cases (depositions, briefs, summons, executions), deeds, wills, contracts, etc. (For a complete listing, see the Table of Contents, pp. 1-36.)

Jared Jr.'s papers are primarily letters to his cousin, Jonathan, and they are filed chronologically. Some are in mylar envelopes stored in oversize folders. Jonathan Jr.'s papers contain correspondence, also filed alphabetically by sender and recipient. Other documents are filed chronologically by subjects similar to those of Jared, Sr. Among Jonathan's papers are letters from his father-in-law, Ralph Isaacs, a prominent New Haven merchant. Other papers concerning Isaacs are filed under Jared, Sr.'s and Jonathan Jr. 's legal papers because Isaacs was a client of each.

Filed with Jonathan, Jr.'s papers are Milford town documents dating back to 1676. They were found with the Ingersoll papers. On the back of many appears the inscription, "Jonathan Ingersoll's papers." They must have been used in his law practice.

The last box contains the papers of later members of the family. The most important is a diary kept by Ralph I. Ingersoll during his trip abroad in 1846 to assume his duties as Minister to Russia. There is also a typescript of "The Ingersoll Story", a family history, including a typed copy of the diary.

Most of Jared Sr.'s letters have been published in the Society's <u>Papers</u>, Vol. IX (1918). They are grouped chronologically in this volume. With each letter is a footnote containing a brief biography of the author of the letter. The library also has a copy of <u>Jared Ingersoll: A Study of American Loyalism</u>, by Laurence A. Gipson, which contains material from this collection, and Ingersoll's <u>Letters Relating to the Stamp Act</u>. The originals, with notes, are in the collection. Other materials in the library related to the Ingersoll Papers are in the Dana Collection: Vol. 2A, pp. 83A-88 (the Chapel St. house owned by Ralph Isaacs and Jonathan, Jr.); Vol. 21, pp. 97-113 (the Elm St. house); and Vol. 56, pp. 15-21 (Ralph Isaac's house on Water St.). A plan of the house and garden are in the map drawer.

Dates of the material appear on the outside of each folder. The bulk of Jared Sr.'s papers date from 1742 to 1774; Jonathan Jr.'s from 1773-1805.

The number of documents in each folder is indicated in brackets on the right in the Table of Contents. Asterisks appearing next to letters indicate that there are typescripts of that let in. See the footnote on page 1 of the Table of Contents for the location of the typescript.

The collection gives us a good picture of legal practice in New Haven in the 18th and early 19th century as well as an account of a prominent family. The document, "Rules of the Bar for charging attorney's fees" in Jonathan's papers is an important indication of early bar organization whose existence was previously unknown.

## Ingersoll Papers

In July, 1980, a few documents were added. They have been interfiled in the appropriate folders. These items have not been microfilmed, and they are identified in the Table of Contents by anasterisk (\*).

In March 1981 more additions to the Ingersoll papers were incorporated into the collection. These have not been interfiled or microfilmed. They are contained in a box at the end of the register. An asterisk appears in appropriate places in the register to refer researchers to these additions. INGERSOLL COLLECTION MOST WES

1. Letters and other four-page documents are filmed as follows:

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- other documents are filmed recto-verso... when more than one documents appears, the next frame will contain the backs - in the same order as the fronts.

The film has been checked and all the documents are accounted for. In some folders the documents are not filmed in the same order as they are listed in the Register, but they are not more than one or two away from the original order.

A few documents were filmed upside down - use knob at left to turn film.

Each folder is preceded by a lead sheet : e.g. Box I, Folder A If any folder is not there, it means the material was not filmed or appears elsewhere in the film, e.g.:

- typed copies of letters appear immediately after original letter

- typescript of Ralph Ingersoll's diary was not filmed because one copy is on our shelves.

Oversized items are filmed where they would appear in the collection although they are listed separately at the end of the Register. See Register, p. 36 when you come to an oversized item.

Documents filmed that do not appear in the Register are from other collections but of Ingersoll interest.
