- VII. Biographical note: Joseph Burns Moore was born in Nova Scotia but moved to New Haven in 1888, when he was 16 years old, and lived there the rest of his life. He started drumming on a makeshift drum when he was a little boy, and eventually became a world champion drummer. He wrote a textbook about drumming and trained several local drum corps. He played in New Haven theatres for over 35 years, and for more than 45 years he was a drummer with the New Haven Symphony Orchestra and Second Company, Governor's Foot Guard.

In 1896 he married Sara Augusta Petrie (d. 1938). They had two children - George Petrie Moore (d. 1982) and Merle Moore, n.d.

VIII. Analysis: Collection contains mostly photographs, portraits, newspaper clippings and programs covering his lifelong career as a drummer; copies of his book TheArt of Drumming, (published in 1937 and 1964); 16 medals and pins which were won primarily for drumming and mostly from the Connecticut National Guard and Governor's Foot Guard; and a record Ruffles and Flourishes in which he played a drum solo, n.d.
