- VII. Biographical note: In the mid 1850's, responding to public sentiment, the New Haven Board of Education established special classrooms in two grammar schools for those who wished to continue their education. In May, 1859 these classes were transferred to the Young Men's Institute Building on Orange Street, and New Haven's first public high school was officially established, with Mr. William Kinne as principal. In 1863, the school was moved to the old Lancasterian Building at the corner of Orange and Wall Streets.

In 1866, the concept of a free public high school survived a challenge when the Board of Education wanted to close the school, but the townspeople, in a referendum, voted overwhelmingly to continue it.

In 1870, a formal four-year course of study was adopted, and in April of that year the first diplomas were granted. In 1871-72, the old building was razed and a new building was erected on the same site. The school was named Hillhouse V High School in honor of James Hillhouse, U.S. Senator and Treasurer of Yale.

Hillhouse High School remained in this building until the spring of 1903 when a much larger building was built on York Square. In 1904, the school consolidated with the Boardman Manual Training School to become New Haven High School, although it was still popularly called "Hillhouse." In 1920, Commercial High School was built opposite Hillhouse on what was now called Tower Parkway, and commercial courses were removed from the Hillhouse curriculum. During these years, Hillhouse gained a reputation as a college preparatory school. In 1930, Boardman became a trade school exclusively and was separated from Hillhouse.

Until 1909 the school accommodated grades 9-12, but for the next 40 years, with enrollment steadily increasing, the school had double sessions, with the two lower classes attending the "afternoon school," a partially separate entity with its own faculty administered by an assistant principal.

Greek letter societies played an important role in school affairs, at first academically as well as socially. The first society was established in 1881.

By the 1940's there were 30. In 1910, the Board of Education, instead of abolishing the societies, put them under faculty control. School publications, like <u>The Crescent</u> and <u>The Radiator</u>, were published by fraternities. In 1919, <u>The Sentinel</u>, the new school newspaper, was turned over to the school so that all students could participate in its publication, and in 1926, <u>The Gleam</u>, the new literary magazine, was founded and sponsored by the English Department.

In 1949, the Board of Education reorganized the high schools in New Haven, and Hillhouse and Commercial each became comprehensive high schools with curricula covering all areas. The following year, Hillhouse was rededicated as James Hillhouse High School and Commercial was renamed Wilbur L. Cross High School. In the mid 1950's the old buildings on Tower Parkway were sold to Yale and two new high schools were built, later to be joined by the Richard C. Lee High School. The new Hillhouse opened in September, 1958 and is currently situated on Sherman Parkway in the western section of New Haven.

VIII. Analysis: The Hillhouse High School Collection, covering the years 1859 to 1970, was presented to the Society through the auspices of the Hillhouse History Committee, a group of alumni headed by Mr. Harvey Ladin. Under the prompting of the committee, Dr. Marion C. Sheridan, former chairman of the English Department, the Yale University Library, and the family of Irving N. Countryman, principal of Hillhouse from 1938 to 1951, donated papers and publications concerning the school. Other material from Hillhouse have been presented to the Society by various individuals, chiefly alumni or families of alumni.

The collection is composed primarily of school publications: literary magazines (The Crescent, The Crescent Annual, The Focus, The Radiator, and The Gleam), the school newspaper (The Sentinel), and senior class books (The Elm Tree). Other materials include: the papers of Mr. Countryman (correspondence, notes for speeches, and articles he wrote for The Sentinel); Class Day, Graduation, and Class Reunion programs; directories; photographs; material from fraternities; and some memorabilia (including an autograph book of a member of the class of 1880).

The collection is stored in 15 boxes, 8 half boxes and 9 oversize containers. The bound volumes of the Senior Class Books (later called The Elm Tree) are on the shelves in the library. The remainder of the collection is stored in boxes by subject. All but two boxes contain publication Each publication is filed chronologically within the boxes. The Sentinel is stored in oversized containers.

The school is still in existence, but there is no material in the collection dated after 1970 and very little from the 1960's - only a few single issues of The Sentinel. There are also no issues of The Sentinel in the 1930's or 1944-46, and only a few issues of The Gleam. These are the major gaps in the collection. The miscellaneous material, programs, etc., are also fragmentary.
